




### READING – GRADE 8 (2007)

## REPORT OF DIRECTOR AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Barnwell County Career Center (BCCC) is one of eleven multi-district centers in South Carolina. BCCC serves students from Barnwell School Districts 19, 29, and 45. BCCC had 486 students enrolled in thirteen career programs in the fall of 2008.

Students were involved in School-to-Work activities. Activities include shadowing, cooperative education, and clinicals at 20 different business and industries. Cooperative education sites included Barnwell County Hospital, Barnwell County Nursing Home, Healthwise, Barnwell Pediatrics, Daniels' Pharmacy, Dr. Terry Fakoury's Dental office, Bedford's Stay and Play, Barnwell County Sheriff's Office, Barnwell City Police Office, Williston Police Office, Barnwell Elementary School, Kelly-Edwards Elementary School, Givens Auto Repair, Strobel Tire and Auto, B&B Ford, Inc., Auto Supply and Service, The Shop, and Augusta Fiberglass.

Forty-one students were inducted into this year's National Technical Honor Society. Student organizations such as Skills USA, HOSA, FFA, and FCCLA were active at BCCC. Memberships allow for students to participate in regional, state, and national competitions in their programs of study. Ten students participated in the Skills USA competition in Greenville, SC. Forty-six students participated in the State HOSA competition in Charleston, SC. Three students placed first in this competition and eighteen additional students placed in the competitions.

BCCC provided the opportunity for all secondary teachers in Barnwell County to participate in curriculum integration activities during the 2007-2008 school year. Students in Agriculture Education participated in Future Farmers of America. FFA was involved in the regional meeting at the State House and assisted in various activities at the Barnwell County Clemson Extension Service. Additionally, the Agricultural Education classes coordinated and held a very successful State Rodeo Competition.

BCCC had a total of 109 students from the three district high schools who completed training at the Center. Of the 2007 Career and Technology completers eligible for placement, 98.4% were placed in secondary programs, the military, or gainful employment.

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
