

**District Superintendent's Report**

York District Three continues to be a growing district where students learn, grow, connect and thrive. Belleview and Old Pointe elementary schools were named Red Carpet schools. Oakdale Elementary was selected as one of 22 winners in 17 states in the Milliken Festival for Youth program. Richmond Drive Elementary was the only school in S.C. to receive the Literacy Spot School award. Northside Elementary School of the Arts received the S.C. Creative Ticket School of Excellence Award, and was one of the five schools in the nation cited by the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts. The Purple Regiment at Northwestern placed fourth in the state AAAA marching band championship. The Rock Hill High Band of Distinction placed third in the 5A championship, and their percussion ensembles won three state championships. 41 high school students qualified for All-State chorus and more than 150 students qualified for All-Region and All-State bands. Sullivan and Saluda Trail middle schools were approved to offer an International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme.

24 teachers became National Board Certified, bringing the district's total of certifiers to over 225 and ranking seventh in the state. Castle Heights became the first middle school in the district to receive accreditation by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. South Pointe's school newsletter, South Pointe in the News (SPIN), received the Palmetto Award from the S.C. Scholastic Press Association. Bands from five of our secondary schools received the S.C. Outstanding Performance Award. Rosewood Elementary was honored for its efforts "to close the achievement gap" among students of differing economic, racial, and ethnic groups. Early Childhood Education students at the Applied Technology Center placed first in the Service Division in the state FCCLA for their numerous philanthropic efforts. Students at Rawlinson Road Middle had the second highest fundraiser in the state for the Leukemia Society. The boys' soccer team at Northwestern won the state 4A championship.

We will continue our mission to provide all students with challenging work that authentically engages them in the learning process and prepares them for successful futures.
