



## REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

This school year commenced with a school opening luncheon attended by all district employees. Dr. Cleo Faith Richardson, Deputy Superintendent at the SC Department of Education, was the guest speaker, and his words set the tone for our school year.

While 2007-2008 presented some challenges for the district, we celebrated many accomplishments. These included Denmark-Olar High School's accomplishment of having the highest HSAP gains in our region; a high school graduation rate increase from 73.0% to 79.0%; an end to our district's \$162,000 deficit and a current \$30,000 surplus; perfect scores (all indicators fulfilled) on the 2007-2008 External Review Team district report; a \$205,294 pregnancy prevention partnership grant from the South Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (SCHHS) to expand school/community-based adolescent pregnancy prevention services for eligible adolescents enrolled in Bamberg School District Two; grants totaling \$3,328,452. The district also met all six of the Perkins Standards for Career and Technology Education.

I extend thanks to the community, school board, school staff and administration, parents, teachers, and students for working together to make a difference in the lives of the students we serve.
