


PACT PERFORMANCE

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

It has been a very exciting year at Alice Drive Elementary (ADE)! During the course of the year, ADE received accreditation through District Accreditation with SACS/CASI . The visiting team made ADE a stop for interviews of faculty, students, and parents.

Our library received a grant that provided enough funds for new books, more technology, and a classroom set of laptops that can be used in the classrooms. This spring, we were recognized by the State Department of Education as a Red Carpet School. This award recognizes schools that provide good customer service and are warm, welcoming places for parents, students, and visitors.

As an indicator of the quality of our faculty, ADE's Teacher of the Year was selected as the District Teacher of the Year. Five faculty members completed their Masters degrees, and another teacher was added to our list of National Board Certified Teachers.

Students were recognized for their achievements as well. One represented our district in the Lt. Governor's Essay Contest while a second grader was recognized for her efforts in raising funds for the American Heart Association. The Student Council continued its tradition of helping both the school and the community. Through its leadership we held a canned food drive, collected funds for Toys for Tots, sponsored families at Christmas as well as helping out in the office and providing nameplates for all classrooms in the school. Our fourth graders were recognized by St. Jude's Hospital for their continued support of cancer research through their participation in the Math-a-thon.

Through the efforts of our PTA and SIC, special activities for students, workshops for parents and additional avenues for stakeholders to gain ownership in ADE evolved through the dedicated efforts of active volunteers and staff.

ADE diligently has pursued its mission to provide a positive school environment and provide developmentally appropriate learning experiences for all our students. Incorporation of programs such as READ 180, Accelerated Reader, Classworks, literacy groups, Reading Recovery, math manipulatives, classroom science projects, as well as other strategies, has provided all students a chance to learn and grow academically. Field trips to the aquarium, Myrtle Beach, State Museum, Edventure, and other destinations of interest have expanded our students' learning experiences.

We strive to make ADE a place where everyone feels welcome and where everyone can become a part of our community.
