


REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The mission of Lugoff-Elgin High School is to give every student the opportunity to succeed in an increasingly complex society. We strive to create an environment that is conducive to learning and welcoming to our community. This year, we are very proud to be recognized as a Red Carpet School. We had two teachers receive National Board Certification, bringing the total number of teachers with National Board Certification to seventeen, which is over 20% of our faculty.

The class of 2008, consisting of 284 graduates, earned over 2.8 million dollars in scholarships. We had one National Merit Finalist, one National Achievement Finalist, and one National Achievement Semifinalist. Seventy-nine of the graduates qualified for the LIFE Scholarship, fourteen earned the prestigious Palmetto Fellows Scholarship, and four students received South Carolina Teaching Fellows. Seventy-seven seniors were honor graduates, and twenty earned the Kershaw County Academic Medal. We constantly strive to improve our school through innovative programs, technology integration, and community involvement. We received a planning grant for The High Schools That Work program to be implemented in 2008-2009. To meet student demand, we added courses in marketing, entrepreneurship, hospitality and tourism. In our fourth year of the district's award winning i-Can project, students in all grades received laptops to use at school and at home, and 75 classrooms received Promethean Boards. We conducted our second annual Showcase of Majors, providing parents an opportunity to discuss their child's major with teachers and guidance counselors. The School Improvement Council sponsored a well attended community awareness program on Internet safety.

The Holiday Hopes program, in its second year, included performances by our chorus, gospel choir, and drama group, as well as provided students an opportunity to assist the community. Clubs chose county charities and helped them by providing money, food, toys, and clothing. Our teacher cadet program partnered with our Student Government Association to conduct a school-wide book drive for needy schools within the state, collecting over 1,000 books. Extracurricular activities continued making a positive impact on students. Our economics teams won first and fourth places in the State Economics Challenge. Our yearbook and newspaper received numerous state awards, and one band student was named to the All-American Band. Many athletic teams and individual athletes competed in post-season play past the regional level. Our wrestling team had the Most Outstanding State Wrestler who was also a third time State Champion. We had two second-time State Champions, one in wrestling and one in pole vaulting. Nine students were named State Scholar Athletes. Our chorus, in its first year, received an excellent rating at Lander University's choir fest.

We serve a rapidly growing community and will have expanded athletic facilities in the fall. In January 2009, Lugoff Middle School will move to a new building, and their old building will be remodeled for our use. At Lugoff-Elgin High School, students, teachers, parents, and community work jointly to create an environment where students thrive, experience success, and receive the best possible
