

Our warm, inviting school serves approximately 1175 fourth and fifth grade students. Our well-trained, professional, and dedicated staff work diligently to provide every child with academic experiences that extend beyond the classroom so that our students achieve their fullest potential.

The leaders of tomorrow must begin today as we expose our students to the latest technology, communications, and culture. We are very proud of our exceptional band, chorus, orchestra, art, physical fitness, drama, career/computer explorations, German, and Spanish courses. Each program is dedicated to educating the whole child and allowing them to discover their individual talents. Technological instruction is integrated into the core academic subjects with the use of 31 Promethean boards. Students are actively involved in the learning with the use of activotes, unitedstreaming clips, and interactive lessons developed by the classroom teachers.

The 2007-2008 school year proved to be successful for teachers and students. BSIS received \$17,302.00 for the Palmetto Silver Award Program. Several teachers received grants from Donorschoose. The guidance department received a grant from Mary Black Hospital for Groovy Grieving. Another teacher received a grant for Schools Attuned training. Students also had a very successful year. The Odyssey of the Mind team placed 2nd at the SC State Competition for Division II Road Rally Problem. They also received the OMER Sportsmanship Award. They competed in the World competition in Maryland and placed 30th out of 50 teams. Eight students also received scholarships to The Spartanburg Junior Writing Project and four students attended the Young Writers' Conference in Columbia. The orchestra earned a Superior at the SC Music Educators' Association Concert Festival. The students were also recognized for contributing \$18,800.00 to the March of Dimes.
