



REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

We are extremely proud of the students, faculty, and staff of Blacksburg Primary for their hard work and dedication this year. We have made improvements and gains in many areas to help our students take a giant step forward in becoming successful students and lifelong learners. While creating a safe and nurturing environment, we strive to engage students through the best instructional practices and challenging experiences. It is our goal to provide multi-sensory instruction and developmental-appropriate activities for all students. We believe that at the primary level, a foundation for education is built and that these years are very important years in a student's success. We believe that "Kids are Special People" and that all kids can learn.

In an effort to increase achievement and improve student learning, Blacksburg Primary established a Professional Learning Community. We met weekly, focusing on reading/writing and developmental-appropriate activities that meet the needs of young children. We also focused on activities that help meet the social/emotional needs of primary children. We completed our final year of the South Carolina Reading Initiative. We had extensive staff development in reading, writing, and the use of technology. Two teachers were Reading Recovery trained, and six teachers completed Montessori training and received certification. We were able to offer reading intervention to small groups of students to help bring them up to grade level in reading and writing. We implemented a Montessori first grade and will add an additional Montessori first-grade class during the 2008-2009 school year. We will continue to offer 3K, 4K, and 5K Creative Curriculum and Montessori classrooms. All of our 4K classes are full day.

Mrs. Lindsay Feller was our Teacher of the Year, and Mrs. Terri Phillips was our Reading Teacher of the Year. We have two teachers who have received National Board Certification and several others who are pursuing that certification. Our school is very active in community projects. We participated in Jump Rope For Heart, Relay For Life, March of Dimes, and the Reduce Reuse Recycle Campaign. Blacksburg Primary took the top honor in this twelve weeks campaign. We recycled 9,576 pounds of paper.

As we look ahead to the 2008-2009 year, we will make it a priority, as always, to ensure that your children receive a strong beginning to their educational career in the safest environment possible. We will continue our emphasis on reading, writing, and mathematics. The use of manipulatives in mathematics will continue to be emphasized in helping students work from the concrete to the abstract. We will have a heavy emphasis on "Thinking Maps" and critical thinking activities. We thank you for your continued support and look forward to a prosperous 2008-2009 year.
