Definitions of Performance Rating Terms

- * Technical Skill Attainment --- The percentage of students enrolled in career and technology courses at the center who earn a 2.0 or above on the final course grade.
- * Graduation Rate --- The percentage of 12th grade career and technology students who graduate in the spring.
- * Placement Rate --- The percentage of career and technology completers available for placement over a 3-year period who are actually placed in postsecondary instruction, military services, or employment.

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Report of Director and School Improvement Council

Enoree Career and Technology Center is located in Northern Greenville County, just south of Travelers Rest. The center was built in 1973, and a four million dollar renovation was completed during the 2005 school year. Enoree Career and Technology Center serves students primarily from Berea High School, Carolina High School, Travelers Rest High School, and Wade Hampton High School; however, students from any Greenville County high school may elect to attend the center for specialized career development courses. Enoree Career Center is accredited through the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS). The programs taught at Enoree include Automotive Collision Repair, Automotive Technology, Building and Construction, Career Exploration, Certified Nursing Assistant, Anatomy and Physiology, Medical Terminology, Cosmetology, Early Childhood, First Response, Law Enforcement, Graphic Arts, Occupational Diploma Program, and Sports Medicine. Some of the courses taught at Enoree are dual-credit through Greenville Tech. All programs are offered in accordance with the standards established by the Office of Career and Technology Education in SC State Department of Education. Our Cosmetology students had an 80% success rate with the State Cosmetology Certification. Certified Nursing Assistant program had 85% success rate. Auto Collision Repair and Automotive Technology continue to work toward National Auto Technician Education Foundation (NATEF) certification. Building and Construction has received National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) certification. Our Health Sciences department meets DHEC standards and the Certified Nursing Assistant program is certified by the State of South Carolina. Our Emergency Response program receives Red Cross certification in CPR and AED. We have an articulation agreement in place with Greenville Tech, and several of Enoree's courses are dual-credit. Enoree students have competed in state and national competitions and have represented the Center well. An Automotive Technology student won the state Skills USA Automotive Technology competition and will compete in national Skills USA Cabinetmaking in June. A Building Construction student placed second in the state Skills USA Cabinetmaking competition. Every student received academic assistance by using the Key Train Employment skills training software. 84% of Enoree's second year students received a WorkKeys Employment Skills Certificate. The Center selected students of the month in each program at the school. Students of the year in each program were recognized at the Center's awards day, as well as director's awards winners, citizenship awards winners and scholarship recipients. Outstanding students are awarded membership in the National Technical Honor Society. Enoree Career and Technology Center was named a Palmetto Gold School by the State Department of Education. Enoree offers single semester introduction courses in almost every program at the center. This change in scheduling, along with the staff's recruitment efforts, has resulted in a 55% increase in enrollment for the 2009-2010 year. Enoree, in conjunction with Greenville Tech, will offer a Culinary Arts Program next year. Enoree maintains a great degree of flexibility in classes and curriculum in order to meet the needs of our students, their home base schools, and the community around us. Our goal is to prepare our students for the future, whether it is entering the work force or continuing their education in a post-secondary environment.
