



## REPORT OF DIRECTOR AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The Florence Career Center joined the Career and Technology Centers that Work initiative this year. The staff development and technical assistance received from CTCTW has helped to improve FCC in the areas of curriculum, instruction, and school climate.

The Florence Career Center was named a Palmetto Silver Award winner this year. Also, Jason Zheng, Robotics team captain and student in the Mechatronics program, was named Technology Student of the Year for the Pee Dee Region.

Dual Credit agreement was established in the Welding program this year. Articulation agreements were established in several CATE programs.

FCC students received industry certification in Mechatronics, Health Science, Early Childhood Education, Cosmetology, Business, and Welding.

Each CATE program has an advisory committee that meets quarterly with the instructor to evaluate programs, curriculum, and equipment and to recommend program improvements.
