




READING – GRADE 8 (2007)

REPORT OF DIRECTOR AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

This school year was one of continued success for Newberry County Career Center. The CNA and Cosmetology programs both enjoyed 100% passing rates for state testing. The FFA had a student that will compete for a national recognition after a very successful year. We are being represented by a Hispanic female in Public Speaking after she won the State Competition at FBLA events. She could only speak five words of English as an eighth grader and accomplished this as a senior.

Newberry County Career Center was recognized by the State as a Palmetto Gold recipient. The school was accredited again this year by Advance Ed (SACS). We continued to enhance all programs but we were able to add a 3D printer to be shared by our CADD program, Machine Tool Technology and Pre-Engineering programs. Our Agricultural program experienced tremendous growth. We served over 755 students, the highest we have ever served, this year.

We continue to strive to offer students more real world experiences. The difficulty of trying to accomplish this was magnified by a poor budget and struggling economy. This did not allow a lot of our students to participate in competitions at the state level. Internships were not as available to students due to the weak economy. We will continue to strive to provide meaningful experience for our students.
