

District Superintendent's Report

With an ever-increasing level of achievement, a commitment to improving facilities, an emphasis on literacy, and a focus on improved health, Laurens County School District No. 55 positively impacts the lives of students and the surrounding community. Students, parents, school leaders, teachers, and support staff work together daily to reach higher levels.

The district obtains valuable, up-to-date information on student achievement through an online assessment tool known as MAP. All schools had a full-time literacy coach on staff, and many had science and math coaches. Due to severe budget cuts, this level of service has been curtailed at this time. The Montessori program is the largest in the state and one of the largest in the nation. The 2009 graduating class of Laurens District 55 High School earned \$2.8 million in college scholarships. There were 300 students who received a high school diploma or certificate.
