

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Our theme this year has been "Connections: Hand in Hand." Our goal was to create strong, caring relationships with our students and parents. Home visits were implemented, as well as district-wide family nights. Student discipline referrals declined as a result of the implementation of Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS). Students earned charms for demonstrating respect, responsibility, and active engagement. Students were given the opportunity to trade charms for prizes.

Teachers continue to become highly effective in the use of balanced math and literacy, hands-on learning in math and science, social studies literature integration, and Step Up To Writing. Our Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) data continues to show student achievement levels increasing. This MAP data, along with district benchmarks, standardized tests, and running records, determine the instructional needs of each student. The data-driven instruction ensures each teacher is meeting the individual needs of all students at Kelly Edwards Elementary.

Thanks to our parents for supporting our school initiatives by attending conferences, allowing home visits, and working as partners with the teachers. Our community continues to support our efforts with donations of time and supplies.
