

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Lake View Elementary, a Title One School, was the proud winner of the Palmetto Silver Award during the 2008-2009 school year. This prestigious award was earned by closing the achievement gap in test scores between minority groups. This award represents the hard work of students, teachers, administrators, and parents on a daily basis to ensure success for every student at Lake View Elementary. The school received \$1,000 for this award. The School Improvement Council voted to use the funds to continue a behavior incentive prize program and to purchase prizes and medals to support the 100 Book Challenge Program.

A new computer program, Compass Learning, was utilized in the computer lab to design individual learning plans for each student. Using diagnostic information from MAP, individual strengths and weaknesses of each student were identified. Through Compass Learning, each student progressed through individualized lessons, which identified areas of weakness. As a result, students MAP scores increased.

Through partnerships with our dedicated parents and community members, Lake View Elementary will continue to strive for excellence on a daily basis, ensuring academic success for each of our students.
