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**Report of Principal and School Improvement Council**

As a winner of both the Palmetto Gold and Palmetto Silver Awards this year, Hilton Head Island High School has a tremendous number of accomplishments. School leaders and teachers worked to restructure facets of the school to improve student success, including training to help transition to the A/B schedule, restructuring of guidance according to HSTW Technical Assistance Team recommendations, and implementing the AVID Program with our freshmen. We also modified the ninth grade academy to support the success of our ninth graders.

In order to reach a larger number of struggling students, HHHS implemented an extensive tutoring program which offered the services of certified teachers every Tuesday and Thursday and many Saturdays at school. We also created a community outreach program with afternoon tutoring sessions at a local apartment complex. In support of academic achievement, the school implemented strict guidelines of academic expectations for our athletes. Additionally, forty-six classrooms received Promethean Interactive White Boards, with many teachers getting training on utilizing the Prometheans to engage students.

Advanced academics continued to be a huge priority at HHHS. We have twenty-three IB Diploma Candidates, One National Merit Scholar Finalist, 22 Palmetto Fellows, 11 Life Scholarship Recipients, and \$ 3,777,475 in scholarship money. Also, we documented a 12% increase in college applications.

Many HHHS students spent the fall extended learning time utilizing the services of certified teachers for tutoring and SAT preparation. Some also helped build houses locally for Habitat for Humanity, a community service project for HHHS students. We are proud to note that our students logged approximately 15,000 hours of volunteer service throughout the year.

Additionally, our students found many successes in various extra-curricular arenas. The HHHS NJROTC earned a Distinguished Unit Award, our visual and performing arts students' work was recognized both locally and at the state level, we designed and held an immensely successful mock election during the historic 2008 Presidential Race, our robotics team competed successfully across the Southeast, and we earned the AAA State Championships in both Girls Tennis and Girls Cross Country as well as in the Boys 4 X 800 Relay.

Hilton Head Island High School is an excellent school where academic excellence is the focus.
