Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Ninety Six High School (NSHS) received awards this year for our students' performance on high-stakes testing and their ability to close the achievement gap between the diverse groups located within our student population. For the fourth consecutive year, NSHS received the Palmetto Gold award from the South Carolina Department of Education. For the second year in a row, the US News and World Report named NSHS as a Bronze Medal award winner for being one of the best high schools in the nation. NSHS was nominated by the South Carolina Department of Education for the prestigious 2009 "No Child Left Behind" Blue Ribbon Schools award presented by the United States Department of Education. South Carolina could only nominate five schools from across the state, and NSHS was one of the five.

The Class of 2009 received the largest scholarship total in the history of Ninety Six High School. 3.5 million dollars were offered to these graduating seniors.
