



REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The 2008-2009 school year was most challenging due to the economic conditions facing our school district and community. Unfortunately, our students and faculty were faced personally by economic and employment issues that had impact upon student learning and outcomes.

At Lewisville High School, we continue to be proud of what we have accomplished with our seniors. The graduating class of 2008 had a graduation rate of 90%. Over the past five years, our graduation rate has improved approximately 30%. Our 2009 graduating class received \$1.2 million in scholarships. Three of our graduates received Palmetto Fellows scholarships. At the end of the 2009 school year, 67% of our students passed end-of-course tests. The United States History end-of-course test is still a challenge for our students, although we improved the number of students passing the test.

Several new initiatives were implemented this school year as a part of the High Schools That Work network of which we are a part. We implemented an after-school tutoring and homework center through a grant from the J. Marion Sims Foundation. Also a part of a High Schools That Work initiative was a Summer Bridge Program for first time ninth graders and an ongoing mentoring and support program for them throughout the school year. We also implemented a drug testing program for all students participating in athletics along with drug counseling for all athletes.

Nearly 70% of our students participate in programs such as band, color guard, chorus, art, athletics, and JROTC. The Athletic Boosters, Band Boosters, and JROTC parents have worked diligently to support these programs with fundraisers and volunteer assistance.

A highlight of the school year was being recognized by the South Carolina Department of Education as a Palmetto Gold School. We recognize that everything we do at Lewisville High School can impact the life of a child, and we strive to make each day one of growth and learning. Without the support of our community, which is very involved in our school, none of our accomplishments would be possible.
