



## REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Dillon High School continues to focus on our goal of academic excellence for every student. Teachers and staff maintain their dedication to providing quality educational opportunities for all students and remain committed to preparing students for a productive life after graduation. Dillon High serves a divergent student body with 81% of students on free or reduced lunch in an area where 44.3% of families are below the poverty level. This has required us to renew our commitment to educating all children and to seek alternative resources to realize our goals. We remain focused on our mission to prepare students to achieve excellence through a learning community that promotes skills needed in a continuously changing world.

We are proud of the improvements we have made in the overall school climate and student performance. Through the diligence of our teachers, we have continually addressed improvement of scores on EOCEP and HSAP exit exams. In addition, our end-of-course test scores, as well as performance on HSAP, surpass those of high schools like ours. Through a grant funded by the Economic and Education Development Act, innovative programs in credit recovery and retrieval, reading enrichment/remediation, and writing development are providing assistance and encouragement to students who are at risk for dropping out of school. Students for the Betterment of Dillon High School, Teen Lead, Interact Club, Key Club, Anchor Club, and other service clubs, as well as mentoring programs, are creating positive relationships within the school family and in the culture of the school.

Our students continue to demonstrate their understanding of the importance of serving their community by supporting various civic activities. They have sponsored a Veterans Day tribute, participated in Relay for Life, March of Dimes Walk for Babies, fundraisers for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society, Juvenile Diabetes Walk-for-a-Cure, Toys for Tots, Red Cross Blood Drive, animal rescue shelter, and local food drives.

This year in athletics Dillon High School brought home our first state 2A football championship since 1947, and the Dillon High Lady Cats won the 2A Region Girls volleyball championship. Also, Dillon High School was the recipient of the South Carolina High School League Sportsmanship Award this year. In addition to our winning the coveted state football crown, our math team won the Pee Dee 32nd Annual Math Tournament, 30 members of our band qualified for State Concert Band, and our JROTC Rifle Team won first place at the meet in Johnsonville. Dillon High School is indeed the home of champions.

The complexity of contemporary society brings with it both opportunity and challenge and at Dillon High School; we welcome the opportunity and accept the challenge of educating our students for the 21st century. Our mission is to continue striving for academic and athletic excellence through continued collaborative initiatives. We are proud of our accomplishments and are excited about the promise of greater rewards as we focus on providing exceptional educational opportunities for every student.
