
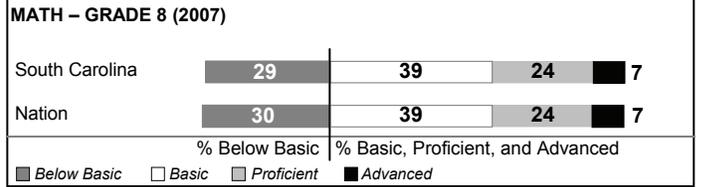
## PASS PERFORMANCE
