



REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

At Cheraw Primary School, our mission is to provide a positive, challenging, and enriching school environment that allows staff, parents, and the community to prepare students for the future.

Cheraw Primary is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. According to the 2008 South Carolina Annual School Report Card, our absolute rating is excellent and our growth rating is excellent. This is Cheraw Primary's second year implementing the Child Development Education Pilot Program (CDEPP). Select staff members and the principal worked throughout the year on the initiative "Keeping Learning on Track" and will continue next year. This is a research-based, professional development initiative designed to improve student learning. On May 21, 2009, it was announced that Cheraw Primary is one of ten South Carolina public schools being honored as winners of the state's prestigious Exemplary Writing Award.

All of our teachers have participated in staff development in the areas of literacy, writing, mathematics, science, and character education. Areas of curricular emphasis during the year included mathematics, technology, continued study of "best practices" in literacy, Writer's Workshop, and AIMS. All teachers continued participating in a comprehensive literacy assessment program. Thelma Commander, a consultant, conducted workshops focusing on math and technology in the Compass Learning Lab.

Additionally, Sue Cox, math consultant, worked with first and second grade teachers on emphasizing state standards and using manipulatives. Fourteen teachers in our school are National Board Certified. Two teachers participated in Take One of the National Board Certification process.

Cheraw Primary continued its Character Education Program by promoting life skills and civic responsibilities. Numerous students were recognized during the year as Terrific Kids, Star Students, Principal's List, and Rainbow Award recipients.

Parents, businesses, and community leaders supported our school through PTO, School Improvement Council, Volunteer Tutorial Program, and Arts in Education. Cheraw Primary School consistently promotes its thriving volunteer program by logging many productive hours each year. The Artists in Education Program and our school's PTO co-sponsored residencies with the following artists: Laura Boosinger, musician and storyteller; Kinetic Works, visual artist; and Bob Doster, sculptor. Children's author Kimberly Johnson provided workshops for our children and parents.

Our school community participated in service projects, which included a community art project and bake sale supporting Relay for Life. Through the efforts of our staff, parents, and community, Cheraw Primary students are prepared for the future. As reflected in our school motto, "We Just Can't Hide Our Papoose Pride."
