

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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Cane Bay Elementary School opened its doors and welcomed 816 students for the 2009-2010 school year. It was an exciting new beginning for the students, staff, parents, and community members who are part of the Cane Bay Elementary family. Our school is located off Highway 176 within the newly developed Cane Bay Plantation. Our population consists of students who previously attended two other elementary schools within Berkeley County. The school's population also includes an additional 189 students who were enrolled under the No Child Left Behind's School Choice Option. The school currently serves children in grades Pre-K through five.

The vision of Cane Bay Elementary is to challenge and empower our students to be successful in a highly-competitive world. Our school employs 47 certified professionals, 14 instructional paraprofessionals, and 20 support staff. Of the 47 certified staff members, 11 are National Board Certified Teachers. Cane Bay provides an exceptional learning environment for all children attending the school. Our school is accredited through the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

Students come to Cane Bay Elementary School to experience academic excellence within a safe and caring learning environment. Teachers collaborate with their colleagues to identify the essential learning for each grade and content area, plan lessons together to engage the learners, and provide specific, targeted instruction to insure student learning and success exist. The Cane Bay Elementary staff continuously increases their professional knowledge through staff development and coursework. Professional development is provided for the instructional staff members on early-release days and district/school staff-development days. Students participate in school and community programs that enhance development and promote citizenship. These programs include Kiwanis "Terrific Kids" character education and the Kids Who Care Project Grant. Other award-winning efforts include the guidance counselor receiving the Mentoring Coordinator of the Year Award for Berkeley County, students who received first and second prizes and an honorable mention at the North Charleston Arts Festival, and first place in the lower Goose Creek Spelling Bee Championship for third grade. A Cane Bay Elementary student won the South Eastern Wildlife Expo 2010 poster contest. Our school has 17 students who are artistically gifted and participate in lessons and activities that stimulate their talent.

Parent involvement is critical at the school level in the elementary grades. The PTO and School Improvement Council continually work together to assist the school with administrative decision-making and student-achievement data. These two groups meet once a month to focus on learning and the needs of the school. Cane Bay Elementary has many groups who volunteer within the school. These groups include the PTO, Del Webb community residents, and the D.A.D.'s Club. An on-site afterschool daycare program is offered to parents to meet the needs of the families in the Cane Bay community. Our school fosters an environment of success for all students and genuinely believes that all students will learn and be empowered to be successful in a highly competitive world.
