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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Allendale-Fairfax High School continues to improve over the past year. The school had 47 students receive both college and high school credit this year. We graduated eighty-one graduates this year. We now teach our Spanish I and II on site. Our students have received scholarships in the amount of \$1,998,426.00.

Our classrooms now have the latest technology with the incorporation of twenty-two Promethean boards. We also added 15 LGD screens throughout the building. We met the state's goal of receiving an all clear and received SACS accreditation. Our School Focus School Renewal Goals, which are measured by the State Department of Education, met expected progress. Our ROTC received a grade of 97 out of 100 on its annual inspection, ranking us in the top 3% in the nation.

In sports, our athletic teams achieved much success. One in four children at Allendale-Fairfax High School participates in our sports programs. All but one of our athletic teams made it to the playoffs. The football team was region co-champions. Our Volleyball team won the region for the second consecutive year. The girls' basketball team was region co-champions and made it to the third round of the playoffs. Both our girls' and boys' track teams won the region, and our boys' team won their fourth consecutive Class A State Championship.

We will continue to make improvements but will need the continuing support from the parents and the community to stress relevance and rigor to achieve excellence.
