

Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Guinyard-Butler Middle School has an enrollment of 369 students and over 27 certified staff members.

The teaching staff at GBMS, as well as that of all of Barnwell 45 schools, has decreased. Class sizes are slightly larger, but they are still within a manageable range, with the below basic students in classes with smaller numbers.

GBMS has gradually increased technology in the school with the latest addition of SmartBoards in all of the classrooms and new laptop computers. Teachers have begun to use the SmartBoards for practical tasks and are receiving additional training in order to be able to fully take advantage of all of the benefits that this piece of technology offers.

Increasing student test scores is a major goal at GBMS. The use of MAP testing to generate diagnostic information on the students' strengths and weaknesses has been helpful in preparing lessons and targeting students for remediation.

Professional-development opportunities in the district are ongoing and most often include chances for teachers to improve their technological skills and their teaching and classroom management techniques.
