

## Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

This year was a great year for Johnson Middle School. We increased our achievement and are no longer a part of the Palmetto Priority Schools!

Some of the programs put into place this year that will have a positive impact on achievement include: First, using USA TestPrep. This is a web-based software program that helps prepare students to take PASS. Each student took a pre-test, and based upon his/her results, were given specific assignments related to their weak areas. This program was utilized in all subjects by way of scheduled time in our computer lab.

Secondly, we incorporated Reading and Math Assistance classes into our schedule. This allows for low-achieving students to receive extra help in reading and math. In the Spring semester, we shifted the focus of these classes to serve students who were only a few points from reaching the next scoring level.

Professional Development was integral to the success of JMS this year. The district's focus was on three areas. First, creating assessments before teaching the lesson, second, Differentiated Instruction, and third, Conflict Resolution. Each of these areas was presented to the district staff during one of our early release days. At future staff development sessions on these early release days, teachers modeled the focus area of the day. Funding for professional development opportunities was provided through Title I and Palmetto Priority Schools. Implementation of these skills and best practices will continue to be a focus for 2010-2011.

Johnson Middle School students were celebrated for their accomplishments this year. JMS was able to continue to offer English I and Algebra I. Students took the End of Course assessment in May, and JMS had all eleven students pass the Algebra I EOCT and seven of eight pass the English I EOC. Savannah McDowell was recognized for receiving the school and district honors of the Lt. Governor's Writing Award. Johnson Middle School students also placed Third in the state in the Stock Market Competition. Members of the Stock Market Team were Dale Clavon, Jeremy Howard, McKayla Plowden, and Desiree Simon. Students who earned high averages, as well as most improved, honor roll, no discipline referrals, and perfect attendance were recognized at quarterly and end of the year ceremonies.
