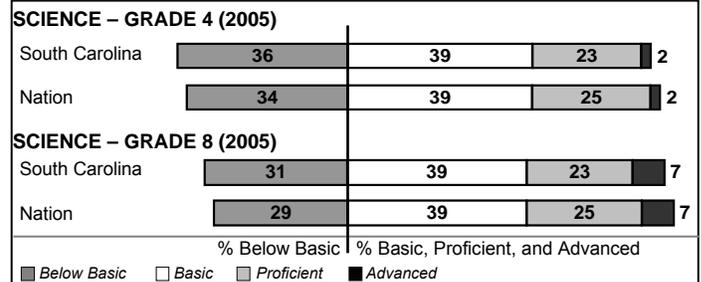
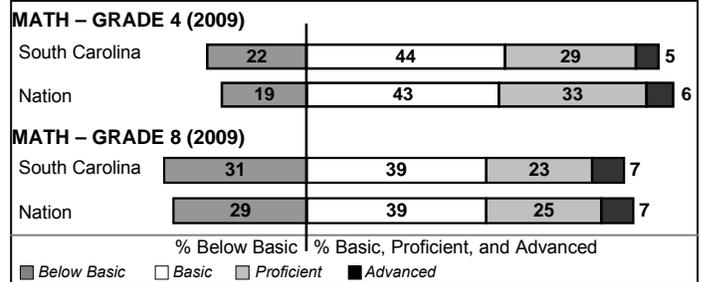
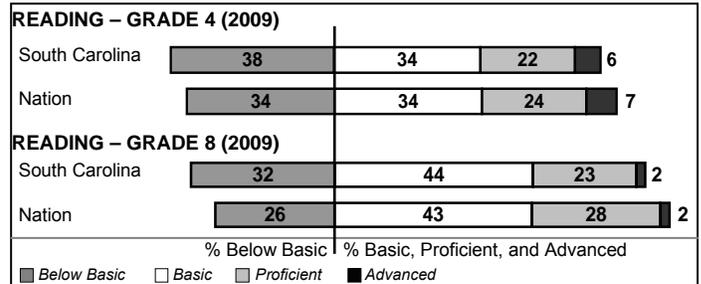

REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Frances F. Mack Primary School serves approximately 650 students in prekindergarten through second grade. Our vision of the ABC's—'All About Learning,' 'Being Successful,' and 'Caring Community' works well to provide clarity and focus for us as we continue to grow as a neighborhood of learners.

Throughout the 2009-10 school year, 17 preschool–5K teachers have been involved in Montessori training, while first and second-grade teachers collaborated to review science standards and units. All teachers met weekly to review student progress and develop instructional plans for students who are struggling. Our parenting programs, such as Lunch and Learn and Evening of Education, facilitated by our literacy coach support our school goal to connect student learning from our school to the student's homes. Literacy and math lessons are provided, and resources are available for parents to take home.

First and second-grade teachers analyzed student and classroom results of the fall administration of MAP (Measurement of Academic Progress) assessment to target our instruction to areas of need in our curriculum, and students who may need extra support. We received a School Improvement Fund (SIF) grant that allowed us to partner with Swansea Primary School and facilitated ongoing professional development for our teachers in assessment and data collection.

Our PBIS Team (Positive Behavior Intervention Support), challenged students to do their very best every day. Special events to encourage and support team and classroom goals included snow cone and popcorn parties. Our Career Day Celebration included many area businesses and community service personnel. PTO sponsored an evening production of Porkchop Productions that was interactive with the audience.

This was our first year to offer single-gender classrooms to our students. We have an all boys and all girls classroom in both first and second grade. Surveys completed by parents and students indicated this was a very positive experience. We plan to offer this once again next year.

While this is the last year for Frances Mack Primary School, and we are going to miss our home, we are very excited to be moving to our new homes. Three, four, and five-year olds will be attending the Lexington Four Early Child Hood Center while first and second-grade students will attend Sandhills Primary School. This restructuring plan will help us to consolidate all grade levels throughout the district. We are proud of the accomplishments of our students and staff. We look forward to a new year of building relationships with our new neighbors.
