Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating



District Superintendent's Report

One of the most influential factors in the effectiveness of public schools is the knowledge, skills, and character of the people who serve. When we believe in staff initiative, staff development, and that individually and collectively "we make a difference it results in (1) Happy Children, (2) A good curriculum, (3) Satisfied Parents, (4) Community Support, (5) Improving Achievement, and (6) A harmonious school climate and school culture all desired outcomes of Florence One; therefore, we proudly review the 2010-2011 school year with a sense of significant accomplishments:

19 of 20 schools scored average or better on the school report card; all three high schools' graduation rate remains above the state average; the drop-out rate for 2010 decreased to 2.9%; 97.25% of the classes in our District are taught by highly qualified teachers; gifted and talented PASS results exceeded the State average in grades 3, 4, 5, 6, and ELA, Math, and Science; eight schools (Carver, Royall, Wilson, Moore, Delmae, Greenwood, Career Center and Wallace Gregg) received the Palmetto Gold and Silver Awards for outstanding student achievement; three schools (Carver, Royall, and Wilson) were identified for closing the achievement gap between subgroups of students; 2011 graduates received scholarships in the amount of \$16.2 million; District One met 91% of its AYP goals, six schools met Adequate Yearly Progress and five more missed AYP by one objective; In 15 of 19 schools, all minority subgroups met the AYP standard; grant recipients are to be commended for their innovative ideas, as well as be encouraged to continue writing grants to subsidize declining budgets.

Excitement is evident in the school district family regarding the new era of building new schools with a financial plan in place that will fund all schools in a tight economy. A positive attitude has been exhibited throughout Florence One in light of budget cuts the past three fiscal years. Although this will be the third year without raises for the District's employees, high standards are still maintained in the quality of work performed by committed staff. Florence One has balanced its budget for the past three years without layoffs or furloughs; Administrative staff, principals/directors, and employees are commended for their cooperation in the re-assignment of staff to new location. Over 63% of our teachers have a Master's degree or higher and 119 teachers are National Board Certified.

We shall continue to maintain an instructional focus in all of our school buildings as we look forward to the 2011-12 school year. We will continue to strive to be true to our mission: Educate! Prepare! Inspire! As a citizen of this community, I cordially invite you to join us in this effort.
