Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating



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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

We have completed our second year at Cane Bay Elementary School with 806 students. It was an exciting year for the students, staff, parents, and community members who are part of the CBE family. Our school is located off Highway 176 within the newly developed Cane Bay Plantation. Our student body continues to draw from a variety of Berkeley County schools. The school currently serves children in grades Pre-K through five.

The vision of Cane Bay Elementary is to challenge and empower our students to be successful in a highly competitive world. Our school employs 46 certified professionals, 15 instructional paraprofessionals, and 20 support staff. Of the 46 certified staff members, 12 are National Board Certified Teachers. Cane Bay provides an exceptional learning environment for all children attending the school. Our school is accredited through the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools with AdvancED Accreditation.

Students come to Cane Bay Elementary School to experience academic excellence within a safe and caring learning environment. Teachers collaborate with their colleagues to identify the essential learning for each grade and content area, plan lessons together to engage the learners, and provide specific targeted instruction to insure student learning and success. The Cane Bay Elementary staff continuously increases their professional knowledge through staff development and coursework. Professional development is provided for the instructional staff members on early release days and district/school staff development days. Students participate in school and community programs that enhance development and promote citizenship. These programs include Kiwanis "Terrific Kids" character education and the Kids Who Care Project Grant. Other award winning efforts were: students who received first and second prizes, and an honorable mention at the North Charleston Arts Festival, and first place in the Berkeley County Spelling Bee Championship for third grade. Our school has 12 students who are artistically gifted and participate in lessons and activities that stimulate their talent.

Parent involvement is critical at the school level in the elementary grades. The PTA, Title I Planning Team and School Improvement Council continually work together to assist the school with decision-making and student achievement through data analysis and program evaluation. These groups meet regularly to focus on learning and the needs of the school. Cane Bay Elementary has many groups who volunteer within the school. These groups include the PTA, community residents, and the D.A.D.'s Club. An on-site after-school daycare program is offered to parents to meet the needs of the families in the Cane Bay community. Our school fosters an environment of success for all students and genuinely believes that all students will learn and be empowered to be successful in a highly competitive world.
