


PASS PERFORMANCE

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

As a 2010 Palmetto Silver Award Winner, Mid-Carolina Middle School continues to strive for levels of excellence in learning and making our students productive citizens! Maintaining communication from school to home and around the community continues to be a goal. MCMS implemented the Redo Café for struggling students in the areas of academics. Transition Nights for rising 6th, 7th and 8th graders were held in the spring to assist parents with new expectations. An end of year Promotion Ceremony was held for 8th grade students entering high school next year. Single-gender classes continue to be utilized in grades 6 through 8 in the core subject areas. An enrichment period also continues to be implemented for every student to work on problem solving strategies as well as enrich the four core areas. The school added an after school program for students at the cut-off of scoring at the met level on PASS in addition to continuing to provide after-school tutoring.

MCMS school wide goals continued to be maintaining high levels of literacy to include reading, writing and speaking. We implemented the next steps in the Internal Instructional Review process for attaining high expectations on all assessments. We continued our previous schoolwide goal to increase communication from school to home by utilizing a daily agenda as a communication tool, the school Alert Now message system, adding teacher websites to include homework assignments, improving our school website and sending home a monthly school newsletter.

MCMS values the key practices of the Making Middle Grades Work Initiative as well as the district-wide Working on the Work Framework for creating engaging lessons for students. We conducted 4 curriculum nights for parents and students: A Day in the Life of Your Middle School Student, Science/Math Night, ELA/Social Studies Night and the Spring Arts Festival.

The school also began increasing communication in the community by sending the school newsletter to all local churches. Community Service Projects included Relay for Life, St. Jude's, American Heart Association, Operation Christmas Child, Juvenile Diabetes, Pennies for Patients and the Manna House Canned Food Drive. Accomplishments included:
