Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating



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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Tigerville Elementary School is a community school located in Northern Greenville and serves 291 students in grades K4 through grade 5. Our school has a community atmosphere in a bright, child centered facility with high expectations, supportive administration and a highly qualified and collegial staff. The dedicated staff works diligently to provide the best educational experiences for our students. We believe learning must include instruction that is integrated, aligned with state standards, and includes opportunities for the use of technology. The instruction is multilevel; takes place in individual, small and large groups while addressing the diverse learning styles of children. Each year, stakeholders review the school's strategic plan and make changes to meet the needs of the students. This year, teachers focused on Learning Focused strategies, the development of common assessments in reading and math, and the creation of content vocabulary areas in each classroom. Staff teams visited similar schools to gain ideas of continuous student achievement with a focus on reading, writing, and math. Each staff member received a professional development day to observe in a school based on individual professional growth requests. Each grade level/team received half a day of professional development to create curriculum maps for content areas. We continue to strive to find ways to move student achievement forward. Students and staff serve the community through a variety of service learning projects such as food drives, Jump Rope for Heart, and Relay for life. Through the hard work of our students, staff, and parents, Tigerville Elementary received the Palmetto Silver Award for General Performance. We are confident that by working together with our students, parents, teachers, and community members that we will continue to make academic gains. Tigerville Elementary is a school where students are at the top!

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ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
