**Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating**



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## Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

Laurens Elementary School is a Title I school in Laurens School District 55. At Laurens Elementary our vision—Laurens Elementary will be a school of excellence and equity in educational practices for each learner—guides us as we seek to create a community of responsible and productive learners. We are excited this year to be the recipient of a Palmetto Silver Award which recognizes schools for high levels of performance. We believe that education is extremely important and requires the best efforts of students, parents, and teachers. To give parents a choice in the education of their children, we continue to offer both Montessori and single-age classes from 4K through 5th grade. We are fortunate to be able to offer an after-school enrichment program and a summer program. Increasing the amount and quality of instructional technology available to students and teachers has been a priority over the last two years. We have added 19 promethean boards for use in classrooms, numbers of mini-laptops for student use, and four I-pads for each 4K and 5K classroom. As a participant in the Literacy SC Pilot Project, Laurens Elementary has benefitted from having a literacy specialist from the State Department of Education work with our teachers two days a month for the past two years. Our students also have benefitted from this project by receiving 12 high-quality books to keep. Students were able to select their books from a large collection of age-appropriate books. They are encouraged to read these books over the summer and keep a reading log. Much of our professional development this year has focused on preparing for implementing the Common Core State Standards. Administrators and teachers have benefitted from attending workshops sponsored by the State Department and the Western Piedmont Education Consortium and from district and school professional development. Teachers continue to have the support of a full-time literacy coach and a part-time math and science coach. Our teachers have also participated in STEM training, the Roper Mountain Institute, and the Teaching American History grant. Also, four of our teachers are working toward a Masters in Language and Literacy through the University of South Carolina. Our goal is to be a school where all students achieve at high levels and where all people are treated with respect. We invite all parents and community members to join us as we continue to strive for excellence.

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
