**REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL**

Goals and Objectives Faculty Council, School Improvement Council, PTA, and students worked together to establish a clear direction for the 2011-2012 school year. Using the Greenville County Schools Education Plan as a framework, as well as the school's own Strategic Plan, Oakview set goals for improvement. Goal areas included increasing the number of students scoring Exemplary or Met on PASS Math and ELA, expanding parent involvement opportunities, broadening technology proficiency for faculty, and improving student attendance. Accomplishments for 2011-2012 Students continued to maintain a high level of achievement as measured by test scores. Data from curriculum based assessments were used to evaluate progress at K5 and 1st grade. First grade through fifth grade students were also assessed using a variety of instruments including AIMSWEB, ITBS, CogAT, MAP, and/or PASS. PASS results from prior years show Oakview to be performing near the top of the state when compared to schools like ours. In recognition of this continued high achievement, the school received its eleventh consecutive Palmetto Gold Award. Teachers received over \$4,000 in grants to carry out innovative instructional strategies in their classrooms. Partnering with PTA, the school purchased a leveled reader bookroom containing nearly 600 titles! The school hosted its first ever Health and Wellness Night and implemented a new "healthy menu" in the cafeteria. Oakview received a Safe Schools Award for the seventh consecutive year from Upstate Safe Kids. The school continued its service to the community by recycling aluminum cans, which has garnered over \$18,000 for the S.C. Burned Children's Fund over the years. PTA and community members logged tens of thousands of volunteer hours to support school programs. Among other awards received at the state PTA convention, Oakview's principal was recognized by the South Carolina PTA as Outstanding Elementary Principal of the Year. Plans for the Future In preparation for 2012-2013, the school will continue building on its efforts this year in the area of balanced literacy. In addition, the school will host a Math, Science, and Technology Night and will take part in a Technology Refresh program to replace all student and teacher computers and laptops. With an established Strategic Plan, the school will continue to focus on goals for improved student performance, while at the same time, teaching the "whole child." Together, we anticipate success as we fulfill Oakview's mission!
