

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## Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

This has been an exciting year at Gaffney Middle School! Our theme for this school year was “We are positive and moving in the right direction,” and our staff members worked diligently to provide a nurturing and academically challenging learning environment for all students. Some of our notable student accomplishments included: four Junior Scholars, the district spelling bee winner, numerous district writing and art award winners. We experienced outstanding performances in the visual and performing arts, and we also had successful athletic seasons for our cheerleaders, football, volleyball, and basketball teams. Additionally, we implemented a Lego Robotics team and color guard program. At least eight members of our teaching staff displayed their commitment to professional growth by enrolling in advanced degree programs.

Our struggling readers were selected to receive additional assistance in an academic enrichment SRA reading program, which had definite, measurable success—many of these students improved their fluency and comprehensive multiple grade levels! Classroom technology integration continued to be stressed; examples include: interactive white boards and Activ Studio software, Classroom Performance System (CPS) for assessment, and the renewal of a Brain Pop site license.

Most recently, our school developed and implemented a summer reading academy that continued our focus on accelerating our students' reading fluency and comprehension. Twenty students were invited to participate in this six-week comprehensive reading program.

Staff professional development focused on common assessments for all core subjects, professional learning communities (PLC), and fostering a positive learning environment for everyone at GMS. All teachers were members of grade-level PLC teams that collaboratively redeveloped Gaffney Middle School's Mission, Vision, Values, and Goals statements. These teams also participated in The Energy Bus book study and other professional development focused on working with students of poverty.

We are thankful for another wonderful year at GMS, and are looking forward to sustained growth in the future. As always, thank you to our parents and other stakeholders for their continual support.

In July 2012, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
