

PASS PERFORMANCE

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Each year, we at Richland Northeast High School welcome the perspective that the State of South Carolina Report Card offers on our progress and our statistical standing among other high schools in the state. Our administration, faculty, and School Improvement Council work hard to help our students reach the markers set for them. We also understand that reaching those markers is only one indication of a quality education, and for that reason we continue to stretch ourselves beyond what is expected.

This has been a year of significant changes, both in the establishment of new roles, the completion and dedication of new physical structures, and the creation and expansion of our program offerings. As principal I worked hard to reach out to teachers, parents, and students in order to begin the conversations about what is needed to guarantee continuous improvement. Through these interactions, I have helped to strengthen our School Improvement Council (SIC), giving a larger voice to the stakeholders in our school.

Richland Northeast High School saw the completion and dedication of our new auxiliary gym this year. Students were able to watch this ceremony as it was broadcast live throughout the school by our Convergence Media program, a first for RNE. The school will continue to see physical improvements in the years to come. The board recently approved \$2.1 million dollars in enhancements to Richland Northeast High School which will take place in three phases. The first phase of enhancements is underway as we work to upgrade facilities in order to begin the culinary arts and nursing assistant programs. Additional phases will help to improve the fields and athletic facilities.

In 2012 we became an International Baccalaureate World School for the Diploma Programme. The implementation of this program was done in conjunction with the Richland School District Two's IB Continuum. We continue to work towards becoming an International Baccalaureate World School for the Middle Years Programme, a designation that we anticipate in the 2012-2013 school year. The 2012-2013 school year will welcome our first class of IB Diploma Candidates.

RNE had three National Merit Finalists, one National Achievement Finalist, and two National Hispanic Recognition awards winners this year. We were excited that one student scored a perfect 2400 on the SAT and four students scored perfect scores on components of the SAT or ACT. We had twenty students who earned the Palmetto Fellows Early Award, guaranteeing scholarships to state colleges. Overall, Richland Northeast High School students earned over \$16 million dollars in college scholarships.

As I look back at the accomplishments of the 2011-2012 school year, I realize there are far too many to mention, but my Cavalier Pride is strong. It is great to be at RNE!
