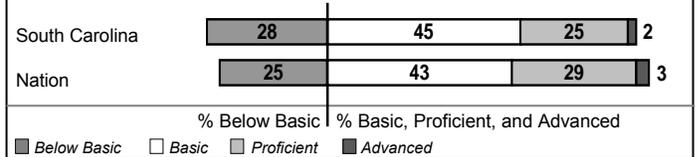

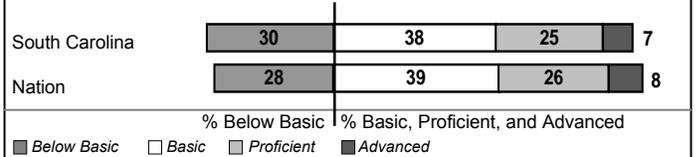


READING – GRADE 8 (2011)

REPORT OF DIRECTOR AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

The Newberry County Career Center enjoyed another successful year serving students from Newberry, Mid-Carolina, and Whitmire High Schools. Many of our students take advantage of opportunities to apply what they learn in the classroom to earn professional certification. In 2012-2013, all of our cosmetology students that participated earned their licenses through the State Board of Cosmetology. All of our students that tested for the Nursing Assistance certification also earned licensure. We had 182 students who earned completer certificates.

Fifty-two students were inducted into the Newberry County Career Center Chapter of the National Technical Honor Society. Our Work Ethic certificate award honorees grew to 97 students. We had a few state winners in competition and had one of our students finish first nationally.

Our teachers are all certified in their area and work hard to communicate their skill sets to our students. Our professional development focused on Common Core State Standards in English language arts. Our teachers are supported by much community support through active business partnerships and our craft advisory committees. We have had many students involved in work based learning activities and job shadowing activities.

We maintain our commitment to prepare our students for a global society. Your input is welcome and necessary as we work together to accomplish our goals.
