


PASS PERFORMANCE

Every Student.....Every Day. The faculty and staff at Iva Elementary School strives to fulfill this mission each day. We are committed to serving children according to their individual needs and helping them develop to their fullest potential. At Iva Elementary, our students are held accountable for learning state standards, striving toward high achievement, and learning to respect themselves as well as others. During the 2012-2013 school year, Iva Elementary served 434 students in four year old kindergarten through fifth grade.

Iva is fully accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and has an all-clear status from the State Department of Education. Parents and visitors are always welcome and our staff truly cares about the children in our community. MAP Testing continued at Iva Elementary this year to help staff better identify the strengths and weaknesses of our curriculum. This year we started using the Fountas and Pinnell Reading Benchmark Assessment to enable us to better assist the students at their individual reading level.

This year Iva Elementary School was recognized, for the sixth time, with a Palmetto Award from the State Department of Education. Iva Elementary received the Gold Award based on overall academic achievement made by students on the PASS Test from 2011 – 2012. The improvements seen at Iva Elementary are made because of the team work provided by our faculty, staff, hard working students, caring parents, and supportive community.

Iva Elementary is very fortunate to have a supportive PTO that works diligently to foster closer relations between home and school. Many parents spend hours giving of their time, energy, and resources to help Iva succeed in all areas. This year our PTO supported our Box Top Drive, assisted in the purchase of classroom rugs, donated candy for our community wide Trick-or-Treat Night, assisted with picture days, volunteered at Santa's Workshop, sponsored our PASS Reward dance, volunteered and supplied snacks and drinks during field day, and donated prizes and medals to encourage students to set a goal of being on the yearly Honor Roll. Our K-4 teacher, Mrs. Jill Finley, was selected by the faculty as our Teacher of the Year.

As professional educators, we believe in order for education to be successful, it must not only inform but inspire and we are dedicated to providing instruction that motivates our children to learn. We are grateful for the wonderful help and support we always receive.
