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Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

During the 2012-2013 school year, we strived to empower our students with a challenging learning environment that encouraged high expectations for success. We will continue to implement the strategies, practices, and procedures that are necessary to move our school academically.

Our 2012 Annual School Report Card reflected an improvement in our school's Growth Rating and EOC and HSAP Assessments passage rates. In addition, our school received the Palmetto Silver Award for student achievement.

The 2012-2013 graduating class consisted of 168 graduates, of which, thirty seven were Honor Graduates. Forty-nine qualified for a Life Scholarship, and one student qualified for the Palmetto Scholar Fellows Scholarship. The class of 2012-2013 also received \$2.4 million in scholarships.

Our school has been designated as a Title I school for the 2013-2014 school year. Title I enables our school to provide opportunities and funding for students to acquire the knowledge and skills necessary to meet challenging State content Standards and to meet the challenging State performance Standards. Our Title I Plan is available for review in the front office.

Eleven (FCCLA) members, who won gold medals at the State level, attended the National FCCLA Convention that was held in Nashville, Tennessee. Also, our school's Robotics Team participated in the Robotics competitions held in South Carolina, North Carolina and Canada.

In athletics, we had several programs compete in the South Carolina High School League Playoffs. Our Boys Track Team won the 2013 Class AA State Championship. Our school once again hosted the 2013 Lower State Track Meet and the South Carolina High School League (SCHSL) Leadership Conference.

The faculty and staff of Woodland High School are committed to developing life-long learners who will have a positive impact on our global world.

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ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
