

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## Report of Principal and School Improvement Council

McCormick Middle School engaged in practices to encourage a college and/or career ready setting commensurate with the Common Core Curriculum. Staff participated in professional development activities to enhance their skills, utilized resources such as College Board Springboard materials, and worked to establish a physical culture with college and career emphasis.

Efforts to support the progression of student achievement were purported by offering academic support initiatives. Students were identified for placement in English and Math Strategies classes and Learning Labs based on Measures of Academic Performance (MAP) and/or PASS test scores. Assignment make up sessions were offered to students via ZAP (Zeros Aren't Permitted) during a designated time each day.

Students were administered MAP during the first and second semester as well as quarterly benchmark tests. Students were awarded numerous incentives for reaching established targets on MAP and meeting or exceeding standards on PASS. An academic awards program was held each quarter to recognize classroom performance.

McCormick Middle School continued its progression on being proactive in addressing student behavior. Establishing and practicing procedures was again heavily emphasized. Student expectations were conveyed and students were taught how to behave. Students were recognized for conducting themselves accordingly with praise and incentives. The character and citizenship of our students is held with much regard by our faculty/staff as paramount for their success.

The extracurricular programs endured some enjoyable experiences. Band students traveled to events on college campuses such as South Carolina State University and North Carolina A & T State University to enhance and display their abilities. Athletic programs experienced successful seasons with winning records, which was highlighted by a 13-1 record by the girls' basketball team.

Parent-Teacher Conference Days were held during a given quarter as well as Report Card Pick-Up Days each semester. Additionally, parents were extended an opportunity to attend a Family Night and volunteer for various school activities.

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
