

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**Report of Principal and School Improvement Council**

The school year 2012-13 was a year of dramatic change for York Preparatory Academy in a number of areas.

We welcomed a new Managing Director, Wayne McIntosh, a new Academic Director, Dr. Carlos Grant, and 23 new teachers.

YPA began the school year with a split campus. Kindergarten through 8th grade were located at the new beautiful 43-acre facility on Eastview Drive and the high school opened at the old Trinity campus. Upon completion of our new Student Union, the high school relocated to the Eastview Campus. We plan to open our 4th new building, the high school, in August of 2013.

Our enrollment underwent drastic change as we grew from 750 to almost 1100 students in grades K through 10. We will add 11th grade in 2013-14 and our first graduating class will be in the year 2014-15.

The YPA band continued to grow and excel in competition and our Spring production of "Every Little Crook and Nanny" was a roaring success. YPA continues to be involved in our community through blood drives, Angel Tree, food drives, Rolling in Rock Hill, Carolina Community Scholars, and hosting local HOA meetings.

YPA also underwent an AdvancEd visit this spring in an attempt to gain accreditation through this prestigious organization. We will know our results soon.

YPA earned a school-wide 88 (B) last school year. We expect this year to be an improvement. We are graded as a K-10 school.

YPA has been selected as a Character Counts model school for 2012-13 and we will become a Regional Training Center for the California-based Character Counts organization this fall. We continue to "live the Charter" as we engage and challenge each student to become lifelong learners, independent thinkers, respectful individuals, and responsible citizens.

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
