Percent of Student PASS Records Matched for Purpose of Computing Growth Rating



District Superintendent's Report

Florence County School District Three celebrates the many accomplishments of our students, staff, administrators and schools during the 2014-2015 school year.

Three FCSD3 schools earned Palmetto Gold and Silver Awards from the State Department of Education. J. Paul Truluck Middle, Lake City Elementary and Main Street Elementary schools each received the Palmetto Gold Award for general performance and a Silver Award for closing the achievement gap.

To better meet the instructional needs of students, FCSD3 is changing the grade structures at elementary and middle schools in Lake City beginning with the 2014-2015 school year. Lake City Elementary will serve students in kindergarten through second grades, while Main Street Elementary will serve students in third through fifth grades. The district also will restructure grades at both middle schools. J. Paul Truluck will house sixth graders only, while Ronald E. McNair Middle School will serve seventh and eighth graders.

Beginning with the 2014-2015 school year, Students entering eighth and ninth grades will see a change in the style of instruction they receive as the district begins to phase in the New Tech curriculum. The district will implement New Tech in the seventh and tenth grades in 2015-2016 and will then add the eleventh grade the following year and the twelfth the year after that when it will be fully implemented in grades 7-12. The New Tech program provides an instructional approach centered on project-based learning, a culture that empowers students and teachers, and integrates technology in the classroom. The hands-on, multi-year approach gives schools structure and support to ensure long-term success.

During the 2013-2014 school year, the district opened the doors to its new College Corner at Lake City High School to serve as a vehicle to help achieve the mission of the district, which is to ensure all students are prepared for success: 100% college or career readiness. The College Corner is the latest component of the district’s Lake City Graduation Initiative that assists identified at-risk students in graduating from high school and earning early college credits. The LCGI creates a partnership between the district, regional postsecondary institutions, local civic organizations and businesses to intervene with dual credit coursework, career and college choice guidance, and supplemental strategies.

The Class of 2014 earned \$1,491,516 in scholarships, including 44 Life and 29 Hope.

Students and staff were involved in community-wide activities as well, participating in National History Day at the National Bean Market Museum, ArtFields and Arbor Day activities.

We are proud of our accomplishments in the past year and look forward to implementing new ideas and strategies to build upon those accomplishments and strengthen our schools and communities.
