

There are no charter schools in this district.			

The 2013-14 school year was one of unprecedented growth with the addition of seven new schools, including Bridges Preparatory School (Beaufort), Coastal Leadership Academy (Myrtle Beach), Cyber Academy of South Carolina (Virtual), GREEN Charter School (Greenville), Lowcountry Leadership Charter School (Hollywood), Midlands Middle College (West Columbia), and Pee Dee Math, Science, and Technology Academy (Bishopville). Enrollment increased from 11,000 students to 14,000 students.

Increased enrollment was accompanied by academic improvement. District-wide test scores improved in both ELA and mathematics in all grade spans—elementary, middle, and high. The following schools received an “A” under South Carolina’s federal accountability measures: Calhoun Falls Charter School, East Point Academy, Palmetto Scholars Academy, Spartanburg Preparatory School, and Youth Leadership Academy. Under the state report card system, the following schools received an absolute rating of “excellent”: Calhoun Falls Charter School, Cape Romain Environmental Education Charter School, East Point Academy, Fox Creek High School, Palmetto Scholars Academy, Spartanburg Preparatory School, and Youth Leadership Academy.

For the district office, the emphasis this year centered on developing a performance framework dedicated to holding charter schools accountable for their academic, operational, and fiscal performance and revising the charter school hearing process to ensure that each new charter school has the capacity to provide a high quality educational experience to its students. Upholding its responsibility to ensure the academic and operational success of the schools it authorizes, the SCPCSD Board revoked two charters and did not renew the charter of an existing school. The district was also fully supportive of the increased accountability measures included in the revised charter school law passed by the General Assembly.

The district will welcome nine public charter schools in 2014-15: Garden City Preparatory Academy for Boys (Orangeburg County), Gray Collegiate Academy (Lexington County), High Point Academy (Spartanburg County), Lead Academy (Greenville County, Transfer School), Lowcountry Montessori School (Beaufort County), Midlands STEM Institute (Fairfield County), Quest Leadership Academy (Greenville County), Riverwalk Academy (York County), and South Carolina Science Academy (Richland County). District enrollment is projected to exceed 17,000 students.

Between the number of interested charter school operators and the volume of parents inquiring about charter school options, the interest in public school choice remains strong in the Palmetto State.
