Report of Principal and School

At the end of every school year, the School Improvement Council and the administration of Camden High School are charged with writing a report to the community detailing the accomplishments of the school throughout the past year. This has been a year full of great victories and achievements at CHS. Camden High was named the 2013-14 High School winner in the Palmetto's Finest competition recognizing the best schools in South Carolina. Our First time HSAP test takers improved from 90.2% to 93.8% in English and 83.6% of our Math students scored above standard, an improvement from 77.6% the year before. Our 4 year graduation rate is 90.0% while our five year graduation rate is 91.0%.

The 2013/2014 school year has been a year filled with accomplishments and recognition for our faculty, staff, and school:

-CHS Athletics continued its proud tradition with playoff appearances in volleyball, wrestling, boy's basketball, baseball, softball, track, and cross country.

-One CHS senior was selected to be in the incoming class at the Air Force Academy.

-One Camden High School Senior had the highest ACT score in the school district.

-For the 6th year in a row, a CHS senior has received the Teaching Fellows scholarship.

-Our Academic Booster Club donated 4 scholarships to worthy students. They were able to provide this through strong fundraising efforts and their continued leadership.

-Our Bulldog Pearls program has welcomed 22 young ladies into its ranks.

-Camden High was recognized on the WIS-TV Cool Schools segment.

-CHS had 12 Palmetto Fellows scholarship winners.

-The Camden High School family continued their commitment to giving back to our community by performing numerous service learning and fund-raising projects including: over \$10,000 for Relay for Life, over \$22,000 for United Way, \$1500 to the Make-a-Wish Foundation, countless service hours to our community through Adopt-a-Highway, Habitat for Humanity, and others. Bulldogs give back!

-Our graduating class had 42 Distinguished Honor Graduates, 43 Honor Graduates and 52 SC Academic Honors Medal Recipients.

-11 seniors were named to the Upchurch & Jowers All-County Academic Team.

-Mrs. Rebecca Rundlett was named the CHS Teacher of the Year and the Kershaw County School District Teacher of the Year. Mrs. Kathryn Jones was named the CHS Reading Teacher of the Year.

-CHS continued its cutting edge work with its Aquaponics lab, increasing student opportunity for hands-on instruction.

-1 CHS senior was named the WLTX Player of the Week.

-CHS Students donated over 2000 hours of community service.

This has been an exciting year for Camden High School. One of our goals was to be recognized as a leader in secondary education in our state. We continue to take strides towards that goal this year. Our congratulations go out to the partnership between our students, parents, and staff which make Camden High School the great school that it is.

In July 2013, the South Carolina Department of Education was granted a waiver from several accountability requirements of the Federal High and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). This waiver allowed SC to replace the former pass/fail system with one that utilizes more of the statewide assessments already in place and combine these subject area results with graduation rate (in high schools) to determine if each school met the target or made progress toward the target. This analysis results in a letter grade for the school rather than the pass/fail system of previous years.
