




READING - GRADE 8 (2013)

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Bamberg-Ehrhardt High School is a small rural school serving approximately 416 students in grades 9- 12. Our mission is to provide a quality education for our very diverse student population. Our goal is to ensure that students are college and career ready and to develop students who will be successful and contribute positively to society as adults.

Our community supports all of our programs and activities with the expectation that academics be our top priority. We have an excellent staff at BEHS and all faculty members are fully certified. All staff members participate in mandatory staff development each year.

BEHS has excellent course offerings that go well beyond the core curriculum. The regular curriculum offers college prep, Honors and Advanced Placement courses and students have the opportunity to take 24 different dual enrollment courses through BEHS, Cope Area Career Center, O-C Tec and Denmark TEC. On-line courses are also available through various State Department of Education approved programs. Continuing programs, such as "High Schools That Work" and School-To-Work, offer career and job preparation opportunities for our students. Success in the classroom translated into scholarships and awards totaling 3.25 million dollars for the 2014 graduating seniors. Four seniors were recognized as "Palmetto Fellows" and 87.6% of our seniors scored "Work-Ready" on the Work Keys assessment. The National Honor Society, BETA Club and the Garnet and Black Society recognize students for excellent academic achievement throughout the year.

A high percentage of the BEHS student body participates in extra-curricular activities. Sports, band, Junior Leadership, FBLA, FCCLA, FCA, Community Service Club, Junior Red Cross, Relay for Life and other programs help our students develop leadership and work skills for success later in life.

We continue to help students build for the future at BEHS.
