




READING - GRADE 8 (2013)

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REPORT OF PRINCIPAL AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL

Indian Land High School continues to move forward with the ways in which we educate students. From textbooks to iPads, we are dedicated to meeting the challenges of producing well-rounded and successful students in today's global society. The administration, along with the SIC, have worked together to analyze data, assess our strengths and weaknesses, and develop and implement a curriculum that will challenge our students and foster academic success throughout our school and community. Access to more career and technical studies is available for those who do not have a desire for the traditional college setting. We are one of a few schools that offer American Sign Language and Project Lead the Way (PLTW) courses in both engineering and bio-medical sciences. Our PLTW courses have increases to include offerings that will further extend college opportunities for the student participants. This past year, over half of our graduating class did so with the honors distinction. Indian Land has been awarded more than \$50 thousand dollars in grants in less than five years. Our Army JROTC program remains a program of distinction. Our Fellowship of Christian Athletes and Friends of Rachel club have added to the character education program; increasing awareness of anti-bullying initiatives. Our athletic programs have garnered regional, upperstate and state titles. The art program at ILHS has gained recognition of its artists in traditional and digital art. Due to the dedication and hard work of the staff, Indian Land has become a school which parents are proud to send their children. Indian Land is well on its way to becoming one the best schools in the state of South Carolina. This tradition of excellence will continue, as we provide pioneering educational experiences utilizing technology that will encourage and empower our student to explore the world and strive for educational excellence.
