

Cherokee Trail Elementary School has embraced the concept of helping all students develop world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate by providing a safe, caring, and academically challenging learning environment. We provide such an environment through the implementation of our school mission: to support and challenge students every day to learn lifelong skills to become creative, responsible, and productive citizens. We demonstrate this mission by challenging our students with best practices to reach their full potential and by the continuous professional development of our teachers. Our teachers are always seeking to learn new and effective strategies to use in the classroom such as science kits, guided small reading groups, reading intervention, Write From the Beginning, four block reading, computer aided learning through Education City and Study Island, SRA reading programs, use of a reading coach, and full time curriculum coordinator to keep teachers abreast of new best practices. Each year we review student achievement, school climate, parent involvement, and teacher quality and develop a plan of action to bring about improvement. Information gained from school/district report cards, test results, questionnaires, surveys, community meetings, and school personnel meetings are utilized to develop this action plan. Last year we placed in the top three Title I schools in South Carolina for our academic performance. We are very proud of our strong history of academic success shown by the persistent gold placements awarded by the state. At Cherokee Trail Elementary we have various programs outside the academic world to focus on the development of the whole child. This year we continued to use a modified of the Positive Behavior Interventions and Support (PBIS) program. Students are awarded for displaying positive behaviors. Our guidance counselor, in conjunction with our mental health counselor, works with students in monthly classroom lesson to teach life skills and coping skills for dealing with everyday life situations. We have partnered with Relay for Life and local food banks to promote and teach community service. At Cherokee Trail Elementary we believe the school, family, and community must share the educational responsibility of our young. The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing






