

Gloverville Elementary School is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the Graduate by providing a challenging yet positive and nurturing learning environment. Gloverville Elementary is best described by its vision: "Loving and learning together with passion, patience, persistence, and partnerships." During the 2014-2015 school term, our School Improvement Council and Leadership Team worked together to carry out this vision with the theme, "I am a superhero, I can change the world." We believe that if our students believe that they can change the world then, they will. It is our purpose to prepare our students with world class skills by offering a well-rounded school experience. Our school is continuing to focus on a high level of rigor, hands-on experiences, and active engagement. Classroom curriculum is becoming more and more focused on research, effective use of technology, real life problem solving, and collaboration. In order to address the diverse academic needs of students we offer: before and after school tutorial help with computer assisted instruction, book clubs, mentors, Reading Recovery, Spanish classes, ESL support, and GT classes. Proudly, in 2014 -2015 we held our first ever Invention Fair, initiated our Backpack Blessings program in which students were able to take home backpacks with food each weekend, and began the Future Mustangs mentoring partnership. Gloverville's open door policy welcomes family and community involvement. Our active PTO provides numerous opportunities for all parents to participate in school activities. An example would be our Watch Dog Program. This national program encourages dads to spend the day volunteering at school in classrooms, in hallways, in the cafeteria and on the playground. Gloverville students and staff give back to our community by participating in service projects such as recycling cans, donating food and clothing, creating cards and Easter baskets, as well as fundraising for various organizations. Gloverville Elementary is preparing world class graduates and plans to continue to celebrate academic success while striving for continuous improvement. We have been recognized as a Title I Reward School for the past three years and for meeting AYP the three years prior. The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing






