
Our school is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the Graduate by ...

Redcliffe Elementary is a Title 1 School located in rural Aiken County, SC. Our mission statement, "Redcliffe Elementary School, in partnership with students, parents, and community members, is dedicated to building a solid foundation while developing responsible citizens to function and successfully contribute to others in today's society" guides us as we strive to help all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate. Our focus on world-class knowledge is facilitated by our reading coach who guided our teachers in the implementation of best practices with a balanced literacy approach to reading by providing on-site professional development and coaching. Each grade level also met as a team in Professional Learning Communities to analyze data and identify teaching practices that would provide rigorous instruction and assessments for our students. In addition, reading and math interventionists worked with small groups during the school day. We also continued to focus on improving instruction for all students through a minimum one-hour daily guided math instruction using math stations and small group instruction. Science instruction was enhanced by implementing a robotics program with our gifted students. In order to address both knowledge and life characteristics, Redcliffe served as a pilot school for the Response to Intervention (RTI) and Positive Behavior Incentive System (PBIS) which utilized a team approach to addressing students who were struggling academically and/or behaviorally. Through analyzing data, targeted interventions were implemented to address the specific area of need for each student. Character development was further guided by our school-wide PAWS matrix (Prepared, Act Responsibly, Work as a Team, Show Respect). Students who displayed good character could earn rewards and also could participate in a variety of activities such as Student Council, Safety Patrol, WRED News Team, "Paw"parazzi, Running Club, Library or Office Helper, and Counselor's Café. Good citizenship was also recognized by presenting a monthly "Good Citizens" award on each grade level. Our collaboration with our PTO assists us in developing relationships with our community and provides our school community with family events which strengthen the family/school relationship which is so vital to every area of student success. All of these activities are critical to fulfill our vision. We look forward to continued growth for our students and a continued partnership with our community.

The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing






KNOWLEDGE
