Memminger School of Global Studies is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the SC Graduate by focusing on three major initiatives: the International Baccalaureate (IB) Program, Social Emotional Learning and Personalized Learning Classrooms to meet all students' needs.

As a candidate school in the IB Program, Memminger is quickly changing the methods by which we have traditionally taught. Students and teachers are now a part of a collaborative effort of learning that includes inquiry, discovery and knowledge. Students are taking their learning and the concepts, the foundation of the inquiry unit, to a creative place that teachers alone are unable to accomplish. Our young learners are displaying their innovation through iMovies, books and projects, which we display at an event called The IB Showcase. As part of the IB Program, our students understand complex ideas such as being "balanced" and "open-minded," which form the foundation of self worth and intrinsic motivation; attributes we want all of our young people to possess as they go through life, not just elementary school. These ideas are at the core of the life and career characteristics of a South Carolina Graduate.

Memminger is the only CCSD elementary setting that provides a Tier 1 Social Emotional Learning (SEL) Curriculum. During the first nine weeks, the school counselor visits all classrooms weekly to implement the 30-minute classroom lesson. The overall goal of the SEL program is to support students in self-regulation, teach skills for learning to include empathy, managing emotions, and problem-solving skills to create more successful learners. Children need a solid foundation of self-regulation skills to help them stay focused on their learning, get along with others and work independently and cooperatively in the classroom. The SEL program assists students in knowing and understanding how to learn.



The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing






**KNOWLEDGE**
