


Our facility is equipped with the latest technology tools for whole group and individualized teaching and learning. Students have access to desktop and laptop computers, iPads, Promethean Interactive Whiteboards in all classrooms, electronic student response devices, and many other educational supports for learning. The teaching staff participated in professional development in both language arts and mathematics. Language arts and math specialists provided in-services to enhance instruction. These specialists then modeled lessons with teachers observing to enhance the teachers' instructional expertise. Our school is trained in Fountas and Pinnell's Balanced Literacy delivery method of reading instruction. All students in kindergarten through 5th grade receive Balanced Literacy assessment and instruction. Our teachers, support staff and administration are committed to engaging our students in learning experiences through in-depth studies of different literary genres and small group reading instruction tailored to the needs of each individual student. Our student body is active in many extracurricular activities such as Safety Patrol, Student Council, Junior Beta Club, Science Club, Soccer Club and Chorus. The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing






