

Our school is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the Graduate by ...

Seaside Elementary School is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the South Carolina graduate by teaching skills through real life connections and problem solving that builds a solid foundation for college and career readiness. As stated in our vision, we provide a supportive environment where our students are successful academically and become lifelong learners and productive citizens. Seaside is a family centered school that celebrates the triumphs and successes of our students and staff. Our teachers set goals and high expectations not only for themselves, but for each student individually. At Seaside Elementary we promote student accountability and encourage students to take responsibility of their own learning. DIBELS information guided instruction for kindergarten through second graders. MAP assessment data supported differentiation for students in second through fifth grades. Goal setting for students individually using classroom and MAP data, along with providing interventions specific to students' needs, was practiced to maximize students' growth. Teachers foster innovative thinking and created opportunities for student ownership in learning by using digital software to individualize instruction, using self-paced curricula and collaborative work during instructional time. Digital content used instructionally consisted of Compass Odyssey, ALEKS math, Achieve 3000, and Pre-algebra math. Seaside Elementary has various programs in addition to our academics which develop productive citizens. Students participated in many service-learning projects including the Family Fun Run, Relay for Life, Fostering Hope, a Thanksgiving Food Drive, Jump Rope for Heart, and a school wide recycling program. Our school improvement council implemented a variety of clubs for fourth and fifth grade students. Students were selected to provide leadership in our school through Safety Patrol, Student Council, and Spirit Team. Our chorus performed concerts in our school and community. All students participated in Jr. Achievement to enhance students' understanding of community and school interactions. Creativity, innovation, and exploration in all classrooms enhance our students' ability to think deeply to explain and justify responses across the curriculum. Students, staff, parents, and community members worked together to achieve our goal of fostering successful life-long learners through developing our students' skills for life and career readiness. The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing






