
Our school is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the Graduate by ...

Kershaw Elementary is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate through the collaborative efforts of teachers, support staff, students and families. Kershaw Elementary strives to instill a future-focus as evidenced by our school mission statement – “Building Upstanding Life-long Learners. Developing Optimistic Graduates.” KES enjoys community support and involvement through family events, parent-teacher conferences, Backpack Buddies, volunteers and All-Pro Dads. Building World Class Knowledge is an on-going effort. Teachers have participated in targeted professional development focused on literacy, the integration of science and social studies and math comprehension. Understanding the art and science of teaching reading that includes independent and instructional levels, along with guided reading techniques is strengthening the success of our students. Gains have been noted through Measures of Academic Progress (MAP), PASS and individual assessments. Students are aware of their own learning targets and set goals to show growth. Plans to extend the instructional framework to include STEM are in place for the coming year. Honing World Class Skills is fundamental to the teamwork, communication and creativity promoted at KES. Students use Chromebooks and mini-iPads for research and access to digital leveled readers. Students have been trained to produce and participate in the KES morning news, further enhancing their communication and technology skills. The scientific inquiry process is taught beginning at kindergarten. The arts also play an integral role. The music teacher coordinates student performances by grade level, small groups and individually to showcase talent. The art teacher integrates grade level standards and coordinates the visit from a local potter. Plans are in place to broaden exposure to the arts next year to include a painter to work with students and staff. Enhancing Life and Career Characteristics is vital to fostering well-rounded citizens. KES has introduced and implemented the “7 Habits of Happy Kids” as the foundation for building positive character traits that include interpersonal, intrapersonal, and problem-solving skills. Service to others is promoted through service learning projects. Each morning on the news, students lead the school in singing the National Anthem. Effort and motivation are recognized and celebrated throughout the year, along with academic achievements. Kershaw is committed to providing experiences that will prepare all students for the 21st Century.

The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing






