

Our school is helping all students develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the Graduate by ...

Students are celebrated for their achievements frequently through MAP growth/achievement parties, a PASS pep rally, and our annual Awards Day program. Due to this focus on achievement, Waterloo has had the privilege of receiving Palmetto Gold and Silver Awards for Closing the Gap and Student Achievement. Waterloo was also designated as a grade A school for both the 2012, 2013, and 2014 school years. During the 2013-2014 school year, Waterloo was recognized as the Title I Distinguished School in South Carolina. Waterloo Elementary is committed to serving the whole child. It is our desire for our students to engage in a variety of experiences to promote their growth. Therefore, students attend computer, media center, art, music, physical education, guidance classes and have the opportunity to learn and participate in our archery program. Providing these classes and activities for students allow them the opportunity to obtain the skills they will need to be competitive in the 21st century. The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing






